3. Notes to the annual report

The 2019 annual report has been compiled by Y. Blanker QC (Qualified Controller), a general board member of Plenty Food NL, based on the available information. The board of Plenty Food International is responsible for the accuracy and completeness of that information and therefore the annual report.

The organisation is currently supervised by the board members: A.P. Smits, S.A. Wietses and J.J.M. Koedam.

Activities

Plenty Food International directs its activities towards stimulating a fair food distribution and sovereignty through vegan development cooperation. The emphasis lies on stimulating and supporting organic farming and permaculture. The activities extend from communicating information, organizing campaigns, establishing and supporting projects that stimulate food availability in the world.

Accounting principles

The general basis for the valuation of assets and liabilities, and determining the result is the acquisition price. Unless otherwise stated assets and liabilities are set at nominal values.

Income is accounted for in the year in which it is received.

Expenses are accounted for in the year in which they are foreseeable.

The net result end year is added to the equity of the foundation.

Adjustments to the financial statement

Presentation: In 2019 Plenty Food International hosted an event with the purpose to acquire additional funding. Due to these activities the specifications for event donations and cost are now more informative. Also, with the expansion of the Plenty Fruit Forest project activities to Haiti, the costs per project are now shown separately, as well as the specific project donations for these projects. These adjustments are processed retroactively for the year 2018.

Adjustment figures: Due to a small error in the presentation of the interest receivable for the year 2018, the balance sheet, statement of income and expenses and specifications for the year 2018 have been adjusted to present the right figures. The adjustment is of no consequence (€ 1).

In 2019, Plenty Food International attended the Vegan Picnic Market Antwerp in Belgium.

In 2019 Plenty Food International hosted a vegan event 'Vegan Festival Kleve' in Kleve, Germany. The funds acquired from hosting the event are shown separately as donations for event hosting. Received funds concern the use of (partial) stands and electricity. Plenty Food International funded all costs for this event. All received funds exceeding cost recovery of the event benefit the activities of Plenty Food International. The costs were kept low by the use of volunteers and sponsorships. Posters and flyers were distributed for the event and there was active advertising via Facebook.



Plenty Food International organised a vegan BBQ in collaboration with Hotel & restaurant Landhaus Beckmann in Kalkar (Germany) held for fruit trees in Haiti. The event was called 'Veganes Grillfest für Haiti' and the event was fully booked. All received funds exceeding cost recovery of the event benefit the Plenty Fruit for Haiti project. Regional newspapers paid attention to the event.

During these activities, we tried to increase the brand awareness of Plenty Food International, provide information about what we do and why we do it, and raise donations and donors for our projects.

For the year 2019 Plenty Food International did not have any employees.

All activities have been executed by the unpaid members of the board and unpaid volunteers.
